- We strongly recommend students choose our EBacc pathway
- The EBacc is made up of the subjects which are considered essential to keeping students' options open for many degrees and future careers.
- A study by the UCL shows that studying subjects included in the EBacc provides students with greater opportunities in further education and increases the likelihood that a student will stay on in full-time education.
- Sutton Trust research reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and maths.
- The government's ambition is to see 75% of students studying the EBacc subject combination at GCSE by 2022 and 90% by 2025.


Pathways Curriculum Broad & Balanced
