Why study Languages?



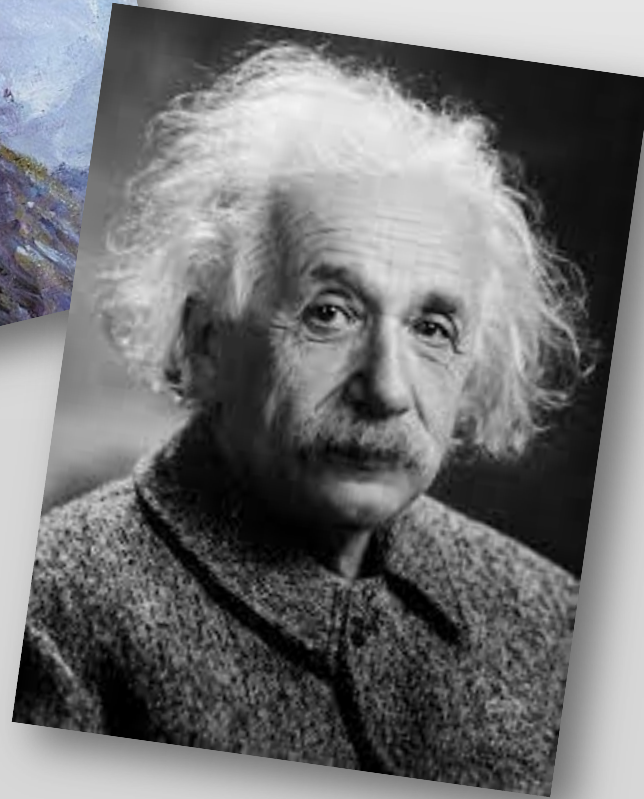
